#### What is an Integrated Care System (ICS)?

ICSs are all about collaboration at a local level to provide the best possible joined up services to local populations. The vision and drivers for ICSs are <a href="here">here</a>. To understand ICSs, think about each letter:

- <u>Integrated</u>: Joining up NHS organisations, social care, local authorities, voluntary, community and social enterprise (VCSE) organisations and other partners to work together collaboratively
- Care: To deliver social and health care, including physical and mental health
- System: To meet the needs of a specific population, area or 'system'

# How many ICSs are there?

There are 42 Integrated Care Systems (ICSs) across England. Each ICS covers a population of between 0.5 – 3 million people. #### When?

ICSs started life several years ago as Sustainability and Transformation Partnerships or STPs. However, they had no formal powers. As a result of the <a href="Health and Care">Health and Care</a> <a href="Act 2022">Act 2022</a> which was passed in April 2022, from 1 July 2022 ICSs are statutory bodies with formal powers and clinical commissioning groups (CCGs) are abolished.
